

Reducing the Logistics Tail

- Sharing resources across services in the theater has always been an option
- Sharing resources across countries participating in operations is increasing in importance for combined operations
 - NATO standards provide guidance for interoperability implementation
- Local Purchase options for some classes of supply





The Challenge

- DoD Acquisition
 - DoD development standards, when used, set the stage for balanced supportability and performance between the services and multi-national forces
- International Standards
 - When used, provide the basis for interoperability across forces
 - Could enable manufacturing commonality
- How to ensure component manufacturing quality process control for reliable replenishment ...
 - ... particularly in light of the changing political climates and new relationships?
